ALOE JUVENNA (al-oh joo-VEN-nuh)

Tiger Tooth Aloe

FAMILY: Aloeaceae ORIGIN: Kenya

| Growth | Clumping | | Common Issues | Root rot when overwatered. Leaves |

| LIGHT | Full sun | | | may break inside causing a drooping look. |
| WATER | When completely dry | 16 | Comments | Very interesting looking |
| Humidity | Not required | | | Aloe plant. Perfect for succulent collectors! The leaves feature curved |
| Temperature | 18°C + | | | 'toothy' spines. The spines may look sharp |
| Soil | Cactus mix | | | but are actually harmless when touched. |
