

PLANT CARE GUIDE

ALOE JUVENNA

(al-oh joo-VEN-nuh)

COMMON NAMES:

Tiger Tooth Aloe

FAMILY: Aloeaceae

ORIGIN: Kenya

GROWTH	Clumping
LIGHT	Full sun
WATER	When completely dry
HUMIDITY	Not required
TEMPERATURE	18°C +
SOIL	Cactus mix
CONTAINER	Wide planter with drainage
NUTRIENTS	10-5-5 Monthly in Spring & Summer
PROPAGATION	Seed or removal of offsets
INTERIOIRSCAPE USE	Desktop, Desert-themed atrium
COMMON PESTS	Mealybugs, Aphids, Spider Mites, Scale, Thrips.

COMMON ISSUES	Root rot when overwatered. Leaves may break inside causing a drooping look.
COMMENTS	Very interesting looking Aloe plant. Perfect for succulent collectors! The leaves feature curved 'toothy' spines. The spines may look sharp but are actually harmless when touched. Very popular in cultivation but extremely rare in its natural habitat.
TOXICITY	Non-toxic and safe
